2: MINUTES OF 2020 AGM

They are approved and accepted as complete.

3: CHAIRMAN'S REPORT (Tony Shearman)

This year has been challenging with COVID measures and the stop and start season Disappointing that there were no promotions, relegations or cup finals with the disruption, but we look forward to next season.

U16 Griffins and Ladies team did have some success with a play off final win and a tournament victory.

Looking ahead we have 51 or 52 teams for next season – a club record even after losing some teams Through age- group amalgamation, defection and becoming too old. New teams created are:

- 4 development girls teams coming out of the Wildcats programme which will continue to be coached by Platform Sports Coaching but play matches in the SCWGL.
- 5 new teams created from Saturday soccer Club: 1 at u7, 2 at u8 and 2 at U9.
- 1 new men's reserves team

Claygate Royals becomes an England Accredited Club (formerly Charter Standard) next season but Tony has concerns on the star grading they intend to introduce.

Club Registration fee levels will be kept at last years amounts again split into two instalments.

Managers will soon receive an equipment request form to be returned by 31 July 2021. Equipment will be distributed at the end of August.

Training venues will go straight to winter venues and no training will be allowed on Claygate Rec. Prior to this Long Ditton and West End are available ahead of those winter venue slots.

Team Contact sheets will be sent out soon, and the information must be completed for every team to be passed to Kevin Warner to set up the club payment system.

E mail protocol please use an e mail that you can access at the weekend as the initial club contact is through e mail.

The club has invested in defibrillators - 5 main venues have them with emergency plans available on the web site – please download and be aware. Live defibrillator training sessions will be held in Claygate soon and every team should send at least one representative. Mike Smith to speak to Tony regarding defibrillator location app.

New trophy cabinet in the new club house - if you have a trophy that you want to be put in there, please contact Tony.

4: SECRETARY'S REPORT (Mike Cross)

New League player registration system on WGS / Club Portal discussion of the process. The SPL are familiar with the process as they used it last season but now all leagues must use it.

When Mike Cross is confident that it is working, he will provide instruction and he will clarify the administration and role access.

Every parent will have to create an account and when they receive approval, they can then join the player.

Managers need to get this actioned – last year many photos were rejected.

For all leagues 12 September 2021 will be the start of the season.

Pitch layout is being worked on to fit all new teams.

Pitches marked the first weekend of September and Claygate cannot host anything before this date.

There will be a downloadable venue guide and a template which managers can use for visiting teams.

Any issues on match day need to go via Mike Cross rather than teams contacting the leagues direct.

5: DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMMES (Nick Ford)

Club Coach and Platform Sports Coaching Director, Nick Ford, sent his apologies following the birth of his son, Finlay, recently. Tony Shearman summarised:

The Saturday Soccer Club and Wildcats development programmes continue to be a huge success with 9 new teams created for the new season.

The club has now also be given an official FA Franchise Wildcats recreational programme for girls only aged 13-18.

The annual Summer Soccer School continues to be very popular and will take place this year 26th July – 6th Aug.

6: MENS 1st TEAM (Mark Ford / Nick Ford)

The team have appointed new manager Luke Ponting

First team will return to Division 2 of the Surrey South Eastern Intermediate league after playing in the Middlesex league last season.

The new Mens Reserve team will play in Division 6.

7: LADIES TEAM (Tara Sparrow)

Ladies have done well this past half season- finished middle table and won a end of season tournament.

The team are Training at Long Ditton rec throughout the Summer.

16 ladies confirmed and aiming at 9 a side. Rather than 7v7.

8: VETS TEAMS (Chris Price)

The Club purchased 3 defibrillators for these teams which was welcome by the teams. The total cost was £2700 with Vets contributing £1350 with the club loaning the remainder for 6 months.
